Burn permits will be issued by the North View Fire District throughout the month of April. You can obtain a permit from our office or from the fire station located at 315 E 2550 N. For those in a residential area please note that your fire must be a minimum of 50 feet from any structure i.e. home, shed, fence. If you do not have the minimum clearance you cannot burn.

TREE PRUNING AND REMOVAL

Please be aware of any trees on your property that may be dead or diseased and remove them. Any tree that is overhanging any street, sidewalk or right of way within the city must be pruned so that branches do not obstruct the light from any street lamp or the view of any street intersection. There must be a clear space of 8 feet above the surface of a right of way. Please include this kind of tree maintenance as part of our spring clean-up and help make our city a safer place. Tree roots can cause damage to sidewalks, curb and gutter. If there are trees that are causing damage to the sidewalks, curb and gutter, please remove them.
